History of Father's Day

History of Father's Day Festival as seen today is not even a hundred years old. Thanks to the hard work and struggle of Ms Sonora Louise Smart Dodd of Washington that just as we have set aside Mother's Day to honor mothers we have a day to acknowledge the important role played by the father. However, some scholars opine that Father's Day history is much older than we actually believe it to be. They say that the custom of honoring dad's on a special day is over 4,000 years old. There are a few more claims about the Father's Day origin about which we will learn in this page.

Earliest History of Father's Day

Scholars believe that the origin of Father's Day is not a latest phenomenon, as many believe it to be. Rather they claim that the tradition of Father's Day can be traced in the ruins of Babylon. They have recorded that a young boy called Elmesu carved a Father's Day message on a card made out of clay nearly 4,000 years ago. Elmesu wished his Babylonian father good health and a long life. Though there is no record of what happened to Elmesu and his father but the tradition of celebrating Father's Day remained in several countries all over the world.

History of Father's Day in US

Modern version of Father's Day celebration originated in United States of America and thereafter the tradition spread in countries around the world. The world owes thanks to [Ms Sonora Louise Smart Dodd](#) a loving daughter from Spokane, Washington as it is because of her struggle that Father's Day saw the light of the day.

The idea of Father's Day celebration originated in Sonora's mind when she per chance listened to Mother's Day sermon in 1909. Fairly mature at the age 27, Sonora pondered if there is a day to honor mother then why not for father? Sonora felt strongly for fathers because of the affection she received from her own father Mr William Jackson Smart, a Civil War veteran. Sonora's mother died while childbirth when she was just 16. Mr Smart raised the newborn and five other children with love and care.

Inspired by **Ms Anna Jarvis's** struggle to promote Mother's Day, Ms Dodd began a rigorous campaign to celebrate Father's Day in US. The Spokane Ministerial Association and the local Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) supported Sonora's cause. As a result Spokane celebrated its first Father's Day on June 19, 1910. Though there was initial hesitation the idea gained gradual popularity all over US and Fathers Day came to be celebrated in cities across the country.

Looking at the heightened popularity of Father's Day in US, President Woodrow Wilson approved of this idea in 1916. President Calvin Coolidge too supported the idea of a national Father's Day in 1924 to, "establish more intimate relations between fathers and their children and to impress upon fathers the full measure of their obligations". After a protracted struggle of over four decades, President Lyndon Johnson signed a presidential proclamation declaring the third Sunday of June as Father's Day in 1966. Then in 1972, President Richard Nixon established a permanent national observance of Father's Day to be held on the third Sunday of June. Sonora Smart Dodd was honored for her contribution at the World's Fair in Spokane in 1974. Mrs. Dodd died in 1978 at age 96.

- 5) The Captain of the day, or Officer that is there, will be responsible to ensure that things are cleaned up and respected. They will also have the right to end the fire in that pit as well.



We are quickly approaching the election season here at BSBRA. For those of you who are not familiar with the time line, here is a simple crash course in how our nominations and elections take place. The months of June and July are the months that we take nominations for each of the positions that are open for next year. At this point, the nominations will be taken for the position of Line Officers and the Non-Line Officers positions. The Eligibility Committee will be meeting during this time to ensure that all nominated members are eligible for the position and will ensure that everything is in order. At the August General Meeting, a member of the committee will read off the slate of the nominated that are eligible and will submit that paperwork into the Election Committee. On the Friday after Labor Day, our elections will be held from 0900-2100 hrs, where members will have the ability to come down to the building and vote. Absentee ballots will be made available no less than 2 weeks prior to that vote for voting purposes as well. The results are announced later in the evening of election night, and will be emailed out, only after all candidates have been notified by the Chief of the Department.

However, we are asked to do these standby's by the community in which we serve. Lets all pull together and get things done. The standby's that need to be covered are as follows:

Saturday June 16: Trislip Tri-Athlon at the Bay Shore Marina from 0800-1100

Friday July 12: From 0700-1100 hrs. is the Cross Bay Swim at Walker Park

Saturday July 13: From 0730-0900 is a Kids Tri-Athlon

MEDCOM has reinstated the MEDCOM CENTRAL (MEDCOM C) link on the 800mhz. radios. This channel will only be used for MCI's or cleared drills. Please DO NOT use this channel for any other purpose, such as getting lunch orders or just normal conversation. This is a monitored channel and can be shut down at any time by FRES in the event that they feel it is being abused. It took us about 6 months dealing with FRES to get the channel back up and running.

EQUIPMENT

Regarding the stretcher batteries- All but maybe 1 or 2 are new within the last 6 months. These batteries have a 2 year life if used properly.

Proper handling of stretcher batteries is as follows:

1) The batteries are NOT changed every 6 hour duty tour. The batteries have to stay on the chargers for 8 hours to fully recharge and charge.

2) These batteries are numbered for a reason. When the batteries numbers are not followed, it is difficult to determine which batteries have gotten on the charger for the full 8 hours. On one Friday, none of the trucks had all of the correct batteries. 3-24-16 had 2 batteries in the cabinet, none on the charger, so one of those batteries was most likely discharged, but it's impossible to know which one. If the discharged battery happened to be left in the cabinet to be switched when needed, it is obvious it will not last long. Now there are 2 discharged batteries.

I hope you all understand the dilemma here. Until the human error factor is rectified, I do NOT want to hear complaints that the batteries are not holding a charge.

Every riding member is responsible for rotating the batteries correctly, NOT just the officers!!! If anyone has any questions regarding this matter, they may contact me at (631) 872-7404.


