Common courtesy call to your captain of the day

We are seeing a rash of last minute call in's, no show-no calls, and members who consistently run late to their duty tours without any notifications to the Captain of the Day. We would like to remind the membership that a call just to give the Captain a heads up would be appreciated as they would be able to help cover that portion of the tour.

For the last minute call in's, it would be common courtesy to give your Captain an ample amount of time to assist in finding coverage. You might be asking yourselves, "What is an ample amount of time?" We are asking that you give a minimum of SIX (6) hours notice. Most people know (in the working world) that they will be calling in within at least that amount of time whether they be sick or just need a mental health day. We feel that the same applies for the volunteer world. We understand that things happen, however, calling in 15-20 minutes after your tour does not help us. We can't even find paid coverage in that time, let alone volunteer coverage. Please have the common courtesy to help the organization.

As far as no show-no calls, we can advise that this is totally unacceptable and it is spoken about way to often in meetings. Members are also reminded that if you have a regular duty slot and you can not make it, you are to contact the Captain and try to fill your spot. (As per the SOP's). You are responsible for your duty slot, regardless if you are a probationary member, dispatcher, EMT or Driver.

These situations apply to all members, probationary and badge, call-in to interim. When you commit to a slot or to help out someone, please do it. You are giving your word that you will help them out.

Starting in the New Year, there will be a few changes that will affect ALL members. We would like to address some of these changes at this time. First, we will be moving to become a SMOKE FREE campus. This simply means that all smokers will have to find a place OFF premise to smoke. As always, there will be no smoking at the entry way when it rains or snows, so please dress appropriately. Secondly, we will be increasing the cost and deposit that will be needed to rent the General Meeting Room. This is being done so that we can cover any expenses that are incurred during the use of the room, such as lighting cost, gas costs, and other overhead expenses. The rate will now go to \$300.00 for all members, with a \$200.00 refundable deposit, which will be returned to the renting member upon a clearance from an Officer. All members are reminded that if they are renting the room for themselves or any family member, YOU MUST REMAIN IN THE BUILDING DURING THAT TIME. There will be no excuses. Being that we are approaching a new year, all members are reminded to update their Beneficiary forms. Regardless if you feel they are up to date, all members should plan on submitting another one, ensuring that all data is current. Finally, all members are reminded that parking in the parking lot is reserved for members that are on duty, and not members that are working outside of the building. Jennifer Davis: An Outstanding Member



It all started 24 years ago when Jennifer Davis joined the Youth Squad program at BSBRA. Through youth squad Jennifer was able to acquire basic life saving skills and apply them early on, before she was an EMT, to a neighbor that went into cardiac arrest. The next day Jennifer came to youth squad and was taken by surprise when she noticed a “CPR save” banner with her name on it. At that specific moment Jennifer knew that she wanted to be a part of this lifestyle forever. This was the first but not the last time that Mrs. Davis would have a dramatic impact on the lives patients.

At as young as 18 years old she delivered a baby. This call was followed by Jennifer’s interaction with a patient close to death suffering from a vicious GI bleed. When Davis’ crew arrived on scene, the patient had no blood pressure. Amazingly the patient survived. The thank you card the crew received from the patient solidified Mrs. Davis’ attraction towards this place because she learned we DO make a difference. Since riding on ambulances Jennifer as worked her way up the ladder to a crew chief, captain and now to the possession that she currently holds, the Treasure. With many years of experience under her belt Jennifer would like to thank Bill Froehlich and Jason Hoffman for stepping up and boosting the moral of BSBRA. Jennifer recalls that it used to be extremely difficult to get people to come down to the building and put in there hours. Now it seems that everybody wants to be here.

“The membership has grown so dramatically which is amazing because we ran our of invitations this year for the dinner dance. For the first time in 28 years that we ran out of invitations.” In fact the membership has grow so exceedingly fast that Jennifer realized she does not know everybody involved in the organization and thinks that it would be beneficial to everyone for the the various age groups to interact more since cohesiveness is such an important element in this line of work. In order to associate names and faces Mrs. Davis politely suggested that as an organization we have more social events or more nights dedicated to get to know the people better. Update on our Ebola response guidelines. Medcom will be scanning all calls for a possible Ebola response when they take the call. If they feel it is an Ebola case they will activate our department as an "ID response". Should we be activated for an response of this type, we have two designated ambulance with the appropriate PPE. These two ambulance are 3-24-18 and 3-24-19. One of the above ambulances are to respond to these alarms and PPE should be donned prior to making patient contact. The PPE is located in the drivers side, outside middle compartment. Trainings will be conducted starting this week as far as how to don the PPE. Should you have any questions feel free to contact any chief. Also, we continue to receive new information everyday and the response plan is subject to change. Thanks
