Common courtesy call to your captain of the day

We are seeing a rash of last minute call in's, no show-no calls, and members who consistently run late to their duty tours without any notifications to the Captain of the Day. We would like to remind the membership that a call just to give the Captain a heads up would be appreciated as they would be able to help cover that portion of the tour.

For the last minute call in's, it would be common courtesy to give your Captain an ample amount of time to assist in finding coverage. You might be asking yourselves, "What is an ample amount of time?" We are asking that you give a minimum of SIX (6) hours notice. Most people know (in the working world) that they will be calling in within at least that amount of time whether they be sick or just need a mental health day. We feel that the same applies for the volunteer world. We understand that things happen, however, calling in 15-20 minutes after your tour does not help us. We can't even find paid coverage in that time, let alone volunteer coverage. Please have the common courtesy to help the organization.

As far as no show-no calls, we can advise that this is totally unacceptable and it is spoken about way to often in meetings.

Members are also reminded that if you have a regular duty slot and you can't make it, you are to contact the Captain and try to fill your spot. (as per the SOP's). You are responsible for your duty slot, regardless if you are a probationary member, dispatcher, EMT or Driver.

These situations apply to all members, probationary and badge, call-in to interim. When you commit to a slot or to help out someone, please do it. You are giving your word that you will help them out.

Should you have any questions in regard's to these requests, please see a Chief.

FELIX RODRIGUEZ: An Outstanding Member



Felix Rodriguez has been a member at the Bay Shore Brightwaters Rescue Ambulance for 8 years. Felix previously held the positions of being the 3rd assistant Chief, and a Captain for the Sunday Crews for 2 years. However he is Currently the 1st Assistant Chief; meaning he is 2nd in Command, making him in charge of the members and he also makes sure that the Stand-By's, are covered. Felix wanted to take the position of 1st Assistant Chief because he wanted to be more involved with the operations, and the membership. Goals Felix has set for himself for his future here at BSBRA is to eventually become Chief, and to become a Life Member. Felix says. "[he] wants to keep the organization moving forward."

The reason Felix wanted to join BSBRA was because he says. "[he] saw someone get ran over in Bay Shore and the person lost his leg. [He] saw this happen before [he] even joined BSBRA, but [he] helped the person and [he] thought it was really cool saving someone."

Felix points out that his favorite part about BSBRA is the members, because he says. "they are the ones who make the department." He also added that his favorite part is also being able to help someone in need. Some of Felix's proudest moments from his 8 years at BSBRA are his CPR saves, when he was elected Captain, the Installation Dinners, when he became Chief and finally when the BSBRA's Youth Squad won all the awards this past year at States.

Advice Felix would give to someone wanting to become an EMT is "it's a very rewarding thing, you get the chance to make a difference in someone's life."

If Felix had the ability to change something about EMS in general it would be the pay for the people who do this for a living because it isn't the best. He also adds "EMT's are put in difficult and dangerous situations so the pay should equal what they do."

When Felix first joined BSBRA his first thoughts were "I hope it,s going to be fun, what do I have to do? and I hope to learn something." However, his thoughts now are that it is a lot of fun, and rewarding. He also adds; "[he] always went on Sundays, and it was always fun, and [he] learned a lot from the crews."

Felix says; "there are so many calls that [he] would say are 'most memorable' that [he] can't just pick one, however there aren't any good calls because if something good happened they wouldn't be calling for an ambulance. But the calls [he'd] consider 'good' are the Cardiac Arrest Saves, but [his] worst calls were when a little girl was raped and when a person wanted to commit suicide so the guy shot himself in the head."

Changes Felix is willing to make to the department is for the membership to become in-sync, and to see them have fun.

But at the end of the day Felix says, "Hard work always pays off at the end and it is great seeing people thanking you and seeing them do better, but keep up the good work everyone, it's a great place."
