Dear Members;

The first quarter of this year has been an extremely busy one, bringing a variety of calls in a small amount of time. As we look back in March, one can easily see that handling multiple alarms is our forte, most of which were on the overnights. Once again, on behalf of the Chief's Office, I would like to commend all of you for the work that you are doing. We realize that it's not easy taking time out of your busy schedules to help your fellow community members. It definitely does take a special person to do this type of work, and for that, we are extremely grateful of our membership.

The Town of Islip has recently gave the town Ambulance companies the clearance to enter the Central Islip yard WITHOUT calling Public Safety. They have placed a combo lock on the second gate, and it is accessible during the hours of Monday-Friday, 1600-0800hrs, and all day on the weekends. Due to the lack of crews on different tours, we ask that members try to fill up at the Bay Shore pumps during the day. This will allow us to keep crews in district when they are needed the most. In the event that you need to fuel up, the combo will be 0911. The Town was very much concerned with the safety of the yard, and asked that each and every time we go there, we make sure the gate is locked again. Contrary to the prior notifications, we do not have to call Public Safety neither before, nor after our fueling.

In the upcoming weeks, we will be attaching Carbon Monoxide (CO) monitors to ALL of the trauma bags in all of the vehicles. These monitors will not give a ready of any level, but will simply beep alerting the crew that there is a ready of CO, and that they must exit with the patient if possible. In the event that the alarms do go off, crews are to notify the Bay Shore Fire Department via radio or land line advising them of the alarm, which will in turn activate them for a reading. We will keep you advised as to when they go into service, and an SOP will be developed and distributed.

Speaking of SOP's, members are reminded to look over them and know them. These are used as the operating guide for BSBRA. All members are reminded that driving a Corp vehicle while on the cell phone is a violation of these SOP's and can face disciplinary actions. These SOP's are developed for the organization, and are to be followed by both volunteer and paid staff, without exception.

We are looking to develop a few committees that, in a roundabout way, will be working hand in hand with each other. The Chief's Office brought in a representative from Red Alert, a company that deals with data that is compiled dealing from member information and members hours, all the way to PCR tracking and run sheets. Essentially, this program would help make us paperless, and would help stream line our operations here at BSBRA. The Board of Directors has asked that we form a committee that would explore our needs and convey them to the Board at a future meeting. If anyone is interested, please contact Chief Jason Hoffman. Along with that committee, we are looking to put together a committee that will be politically based. In the past months, there have been a lot of changes that have been proposed by the State Legislature. Some of the proposals are good, while some are not so good. We are looking for a few members that would be willing to meet on a monthly basis, contact our local politicians which would include town, county, and state leaders, to let them know who we are, and what we do. We would like to petition our local leaders for support not only for BSBRA, but for our missions and goals in the EMS community. If anyone would be interested in joining, please contact me.

I would like to take a moment to thank those members who participated in this year's Pasta Night. I would especially like to thank AJ Seymour, Emily Mongan, Raymi Smith, and Kerri Paoletti for planning and doing all of the shopping for the event. I would like to say that we did great, but unfortunately, we only raised \$425.00, which fell way short of what we made last year. There was a total of 18 members who helped out, but when you look at that out of a membership of 150, it really isn't a lot. We understand that everyone has a life outside of BSBRA. We also understand that what we do is on a voluntary basis, but when there is so much more potential for help, it is disheartening. The participation of the membership is so necessary to succeed in getting what we want. The installation dinners are not free, nor are the games in the game room. The food that we eat during the month, that's not free either. The amenities and events that we have for our members does cost money; money that is allocated each month. I would ask that ALL members take a look at where you want BSBRA to be in the future, and how you see us getting there without fundraising. It is not fair that there are 18 members doing the work that 132 members just don't feel like doing. Please do your part in helping to raise the funds that are needed to pay for the luxuries that you enjoy!

Otherwise, I would ask that you keep getting those calls out. Each and every one of you are doing a great job in that, and it isn't noticed just within, but also in the EMS community.


Dear Chief Froehlich:
