3. Please drive carefully, do not drive over holes on the road " this causes the the trucks to loose the front alignment.
4. Captains always make sure the rig's fuel tank is full during your tour.
5. If you see something wrong with the rigs, please let us as to what is the problem, so we can take care of it.

Being on interim status and having an expired card he could have easily just stayed home and slept or hung with friends, but he chose to spend one of the few days he had home from school helping the greatest agency around anyway he could. A special thank you goes to Lyn Taormina, Tom Komoroski and Charlie Flood for consistently bailing me out of jams in recent weeks. They are the perfect example of team players and have time and again put their lives on hold to help out on Mondays. Kudos and much thanks to everyone who helped out on the 15th of August as we covered 23 alarms. Included in that hectic day was the exemplary assistance we received from 2nd Assistant Chief John Ippolito and his crew from BSFD in treating and extricating an extremely bariatric patient. Not once, but twice BSFD came out in force to assist with the same patient, led by Chief Ippolito. It was only through or joint approach that we got the patient safely out of her house and to Southside and did so with no injury to any rescue personnel.

In going with the beginning of my report I'd like to mention a few things that I think need improving. Rig checks and restock are a top priority. These two things are mentioned constantly and I know everyone is tired of hearing about them so let's do something about it. The very FIRST thing that we should all be doing when we arrive at the building is a rig check. And not so that you can run and write up the crew that came before you because you don't like them. Do it so that you and your crew can do your job appropriately and treat the residents of Bay Shore-Brightwaters the way they deserve to be treated. Restocking should be done at the end of every single call. Most simple restock can and SHOULD be done before the ambulance ever leaves Southside. Also on the topic of restock is a new issue that has popped up recently due to the high level of call volume we've been experiencing. Ambulances that aren't properly stocked due to going on back to back to back alarms. While this certainly isn't the crews fault, at some point that ambulance needs to be put out of service and restocked. The vehicle rotation is important, but so is having all the equipment that we need. If an ambulance just came back from multiple consecutive alarms, take the next due bus.

In closing I just want to remind everyone that every officer is an FTO and a Driver Trainer. I will be more than happy to help any of you out with either of these things. Just remember that brand new EMTs will not be driver cleared for a period of time so that you may gain experience as a tech. Just about every single Officer has a vast amount of EMS experience so ask questions. Anyone who needs help with anything PLEASE come down on Monday and I'll be happy to work with you.

It has been a pleasure serving this past year as an officer of this department and I hope that you the membership see fit to have me serve again.

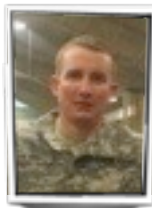
